Over the past several days, the Municipality is currently operating under a state of emergency due to flooding conditions affecting parts of our territory. Water levels have begun to stabilize and, in some areas, decrease. This is encouraging. However, conditions remain dynamic, and we are not yet fully out of the risk period.

Several areas continue to be impacted:

- Certain sections of roadways remain closed due to water levels and safety concerns;
- Assessments are ongoing to determine when access can be safely restored;
- Emergency access continues to be evaluated to ensure response capability is maintained.

The Municipality has been monitoring conditions closely, with regular site assessments and coordination with relevant partners.

At this time:

- No widespread residential distress has been reported;
- Residents are reminded to remain cautious, as conditions can change quickly;
- All road closures and safety advisories should continue to be respected.

We also recognize that events like this highlight areas where we can improve preparedness, communication, and coordination. A full review will be conducted once conditions have stabilized so that we can continue to strengthen our approach moving forward.
